





2023 UN Favorability Poll

Better World Campaign

— AUGUST 2023





Methodology

This poll was conducted between August 10-13th, 2023 among a sample of 1,980 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, 2020 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

Key Takeaways:

Voters hold a favorable view of the UN as an organization still needed today.

Fifty-five percent of registered voters agree the UN is an organization that is still needed today versus one that has outlived its usefulness.

A majority of voters agree it is important for the U.S. to maintain an active role in the UN (73%).

Including a majority of Democrats (86%), Independents (64%) and Republicans (65%) who say it is very/somewhat important for the U.S. to maintain an active role in the UN.

Including the U.S. paying their dues to the UN on time and in full.

A majority of registered voters favor the U.S. paying their dues, both regular (54%) and peacekeeping (59%), to the UN on time and in full.

To achieve foreign policy goals, voters agree it is better for the U.S. to work with major allies and through international organizations.

Nearly two-thirds of registered voters think is better for the U.S. to work with major allies and through international organizations (61%) versus acting mainly on their own.

And agree the UN is supportive of the U.S.'s goals and objectives around the world.

Sixty-one percent of registered voters rate the United Nations as very/somewhat supportive of America's goals and objectives around the world.





















Now thinking about the United States' foreign policy in general, to achieve our foreign policy goals, do you think it is better for the United States to...






Nearly two-thirds of registered voters feel the UN is supportive of America's goals and objectives around the world (61%).


